### **YEAR 11 OUTSTANDING 'FINALS' EXAMINATIONS: MARCH & APRIL 2024**

The Year 11 'FINALS.' Examinations took place in January 2024. However, there were some subjects that needed a later exam date for some papers. These outstanding exams are now scheduled to take place in March & April 2024 (with a catch-up date on Wednesday 27 March) on the following dates.

#### **Exam Dates**

**Childcare BTEC External Exam – Thursday 21 March – 9.00am**  
**English Language P2 – Friday 22 March – 9.00am**  
**Further Maths Certificate – Friday 22 March – 11.15am**  
**Media Studies P2 – Monday 25 March – 9.00am**  
**Religious Studies P3 – Monday 25 March – 11.15am**  
**English Literature P2 – Tuesday 26 March – 9.00am**  
**Health & Social Care BTEC External Exam – Monday 22 April – 9.00am**

The aims of the exams are for students to practise important examination skills and to see what to expect in every exam. They also allow teachers to assess the progress of students and identify where intervention may be necessary.

The results of these exams will be shared with students by subject teachers after the Easter break (apart from H&SC).

#### **Please ensure that students know to:-**

- arrive at least **15 minutes before** the start of each examination e.g 8.45am and 11.00am. If students usually take a bus to school it is advisable to catch an earlier bus to ensure they are here on time. It is disruptive to other students when candidates turn up late and it is not the best start to an exam for the candidate themselves.
- **not** bring into the examination room a mobile phone/**ANY** watch/ Earpods/Earphones/Revision material or any other unauthorised electrical equipment.
- follow behaviour expectations for exams which includes no talking, no turning round, no communication of any kind with other students and to follow the instructions of Exams staff at all times.

Students may only bring water to drink into the exam room with them; however, it must be in a clear 500ml plastic bottle with no labels. This is in accordance with JCQ regulations.

Pencil cases will be provided for all exams. Students may bring their own calculator; however, one will be provided when required.
